Student Selection Criteria

Your university has partnered with **ChangeCraft** to host the Numu-LiTe (*Enabling Grassroots Change (EGC)*) initiative — a three-month, hands-on journey, helping students turn ideas into small, meaningful actions for their campus and community.

To make the experience truly impactful, please **nominate students who best fit** this journey, using the criteria below as guidance. EGC thrives when students are **curious, collaborative, and committed**. Following the one-day workshop, participants will continue with coaching, mentoring and community challenges, concluding with a showcase after three months.

Selection Criteria

Hunger for Change

Students eager to improve their campus or community with initiative, energy, and optimism.

Early-Stage Learners (1st–2nd Year)

First and second-year students open to new ideas, with time to apply learning throughout their university journey.

Working English Skills

Students comfortable participating in discussions and group work, prioritising willingness to express ideas over perfect fluency.

Under-Privileged / Under-Represented Backgrounds

Prioritise students from rural, low-income, or first-generation backgrounds, ensuring gender balance.

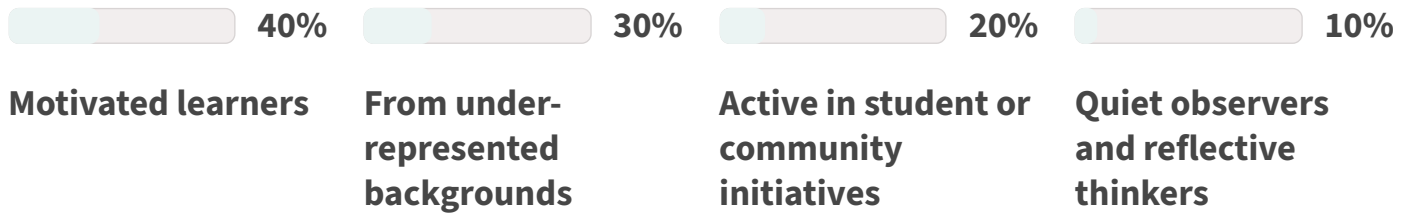
Openness & Team Spirit

Willing to collaborate across disciplines, learn from others, and actively engage with peers.

Commitment to the Full Journey

Committed to attending the one-day workshop, follow-up activities, and the three-month final showcase.

Selected Students

Host University Preparation Checklist

The following checklist outlines the key steps for universities hosting a Numu-Lite bootcamp. Completing these actions ensures smooth logistics, balanced student participation, and full alignment with the Numu-Lite learning journey.

- 1 Student Selection**
Select 25 motivated students as per the selection criteria from diverse disciplines.
Prioritise those active in community or student initiatives, and reflective or curious learners.
- 2 Diversity Mix**
Ensure balance across gender, faculties, and backgrounds (encourage under-represented groups).
- 3 Final Student List**
Submit confirmed list (Full Name, Programme, Year, Email, Mobile Phone) at least **14 days before the workshop**.
- 4 Pre-Workshop Email to Students**
Send short welcome email (template provided by ChangeCraft) with workshop agenda, start time, and participation reminder ("interactive, bring your energy!").
- 5 Attendance Confirmation**
Collect confirmations or replacements 48 hrs before the session.

Pre-Event Coordination

- **Focal Point (University):** Assign one coordinator to liaise with ChangeCraft team for all logistics
- **Communication Channel:** Create WhatsApp group with focal point + facilitators for real-time coordination
- **Venue Confirmation:** Confirm final room name, building, and directions
- **Parking/Access Info:** Share map or instructions with facilitators before arrival
